


11. Grounding or Polarization - This video product is equipped with a polarized alternating-current line plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other). This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug should still fail to fit, contact your electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized plug.

12. Power-Cord Protection - Power-Supply cords should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them, paying particular attention to cords at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the appliance.

## **REMOVING THE TRANSIT PAD**

- Press the ON/OFF button (7) on the player.
- Press the OPEN/CLOSE button (2) on the player to open the disc tray (1).
- Take the transport pad from the disc tray.
- Press the OPEN/CLOSE button (2) on the player to close the tray (1).
- To avoid damages to the CD-I player when transporting, keep the transport pad and reuse it whenever you are transporting the player.

## PLACEMENT

- Place the player on a firm, flat surface.
- Keep away from heat sources and direct sunlight.
- In a cabinet, allow 1 inch (2-3 cm) of free space all around the unit for adequate ventilation.


## VIDEO CONNECTIONS

## I. CHOOSING THE RIGHT CONNECTIONS

Most of today's TV receivers have several possible picture input connections. In order of picture quality, these are:

- Video (CVBS);
- Antenna in.


Depending on the version of your player it is advised to connect it to the TV input with the highest picture quality.



11. Video output (CVBS).12. IN FROM ANTENNA.13. OUT TO TV.


## 2. CONNECTION TO A TV WITH A VIDEO (CVBS) SOCKET

- Just connect the corresponding connectors with a matching cable.
- Since this cable does not connect the audio, it has to be connected separately.




## 3. ANTENNA CONNECTIONS

- Connect the player to the TV antenna input, using a matching cable.
- If you already have a VCR (or antenna or cable) connected to the TV antenna input and your CD-I player has an antenna input, connect the CD-I player between the VCR (or antenna or cable) antenna output and the TV antenna input. You may also use an optional external switchbox, if desired.
- Your CD-I player sends pictures and sound to your TV on the channel number indicated by the channel selector position indicated at the rear of the player. This signal is sent through the coaxial cable.
- To operate the player with your TV, set your TV to the same channel.
- You can avoid local interference by selecting a different channel using the channel selector.



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### NOTE

The sound sent through the RF output to your TV is *mono* only. If your TV has separate inputs for Audio L(eft) and R(ight) connect the Audio L(eft) and R(ight) outputs (14) of your player to them with a matching cable.




## POINTING DEVICE

## **AUDIO CONNECTIONS**

- If you use the TV antenna input, the TV will play sound along with the picture.
- If you use the video (CVBS) (11) input, you will also need to connect the player's audio output (14) to the TV's audio input.



• For Hifi sound, you can connect the player's audio output (14) to the input of your HiFi system, provided that the player, TV and HiFi system are placed close to each other.



#### CAUTION DO NOT CONNECT THE PLAYER'S AUDIO OUTPUT (14) TO THE HIFI PHONO (RECORD PLAYER) INPUT.

NOTE

Please refer to the instructions that come with the TV-set for the selection of the channel or the input used.

## PRECAUTIONS

To operate your CD-I player a pointing device is needed. For pointing devices other than the included pointing device please see the accessories page on the back of this manual.

#### CAUTION

NEVER MAKE OR CHANGE CONNECTIONS WITH THE POWER SWITCHED ON.

### **INFRA RED REMOTE CONTROL**

#### Loading the batteries in the remote control

- Push and slide the battery compartment cover.
- Insert three 'AA' (R6 or SUM3) batteries as indicated inside the battery compartment.
- Replace the cover.

#### CAUTION

DO NOT MIX OLD AND NEW BATTERIES. ALSO NEVER MIX DIFFERENT TYPES OF BATTERIES (STANDARD, ALKALINE, ETC.).

#### NOTE

To save battery power, the remote control automatically switches off (after approximately one minute) if a button is pressed continuously. It is automatically reactivated the next time you press any button.

Pointing devices are sensitive precision instruments. Handle them with care, keeping in mind the following precautions:

- Avoid dropping or knocking
- Do not use them in locations subject to extreme temperatures, humidity, dust or vibration.
- Never hold the pointing device by the cable.
- Never pull the cable to disconnect the pointing device from the player.


#### Remote control interactive operation

For normal interactive operation, use the remote control to select functions displayed on the TV screen.


- · Point the remote control at your CD-I player.
- Move the cursor in the direction you want by pressing in that direction on the thumbpad.
- The harder you press, the faster the cursor arrow moves.
- Click on one of the action buttons.
- The function selected by this 'point-and-click' technique is highlighted to confirm the selection.

#### NOTE

To 'point-and-click' on any screen shown in this manual, any one of the three action buttons can be used. The shape of the cursor is different according to the program you are playing, but it is always controlled in the same way.



## WIRED POINTING DEVICES (such as mouse, trackerball, roller controller or touchpad)



- Plug the pointing device connector into an input port for pointing devices on the CD-I player (input 5 at the front or input 9 at the rear).
- Insert the connector with the arrow at the top.
- Place the pointing device in front of the display screen, with the back (the cable end) pointed towards the screen.
- Now, as you roll the mouse, the trackerball or use the graphic tablet, the cursor moves in the corresponding direction on the screen.
- When the cursor is positioned on the required function click on one of the action buttons.
- The function selected by this 'point-and-click' technique is highlighted to confirm the selection.

### CAUTION

NEVER MAKE OR CHANGE CONNECTIONS WITH THE POWER SWITCHED ON.


- A pointing device connected at the front panel can be used simultaneously with the supplied remote control.
- Connecting a pointing device only at the rear panel immobilizes the supplied remote control, except in certain programs for two persons.
- To point-and-click' on any screen shown in this manual, any one of the three action buttons can be used.
   The shape of the cursor is different according to the program you are playing, but it is always controlled in the same way.

## SETTING UP

## SWITCHING ON AND OFF

- Press the ON/OFF button (7) to switch the player on.
- Switch on the TV (and HiFi system, if used).
- Select the CD-I input on the TV (and HiFi system if used).
- On the TV, the player start-up screen will appear.

*Note* Remember to set your TV Channel to the same number as the position of the channel selector switch on the player (15).



- This screen has the following system function icons to guide and assist you:
- Select:
- **1.Info**: if you need help during start-up, or when playing CD-Audio discs. (Available on some player versions only.)
- 2. Settings: to preselect your preferred start-up conditions.
- 3. Dim to reduce the screen brightness while the system is at rest.
  4. Memory: to refer to the intermediate results of CD-I titles and of FTS programs created for your CD-Audio discs.
- 5.Open/close: to open or close the disc tray.
- Press the ON/OFF button (7) to switch the player off.
- Switch off the TV (and HiFi system, if used).


## **INFO SCREEN** (available on some player versions only)

- The info screens offer help related to the operating mode.
- Point-and-click on the function for which you need help.
- When finished, point-and-click on OK.

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SETTINGS SCREEN

- If your player offers the feature to change languages, pointand-click on the language shown at the foot of the screen to get the full list, then pointand-click on your choice.
- When finished, point-and-click on OK.



## SETTINGS SCREEN

 This screen allows you to change the player settings:

**Time –** Select 24 hour or 12 hour clock.

**Date** – Select dd/mm/yy to present the date in day-monthyear sequence. Select mm/dd/yy to present the date

in month-day-year sequence.

**Time/date set** – If the time or date shown on the screen is wrong, select the appropriate < or > arrows to set hours, minutes, day, month and year in turn, as required.

**Scan time**\* – Select the time you want the beginning of each audio track to play for (5, 10 or 20 seconds) when the scan function is activated.


Auto shuffle and Auto FTS\* – For each of these functions, select "on" if you want the function to be activated automatically when a disc is loaded. Repeat\* – Select to repeat a complete audio disc or a single track when the repeat function is activated. Default Volume setting – Select + or - to increase resp. decrease the default volume. (-3dB per step).

• When finished, point-and-click on OK.

Note: Functions marked \* are CD-Audio functions.

## MEMORY SCREEN

 The memory screen shows the information held in memory: titles, dates and percentage of memory used.



- Use the scroll arrows to move up and down the list.
- To delete an item, click on its title and then click on "delete". If you change your mind after deleting, click on "undo".
- When finished, point-and-click on OK.

## GENERAL

Push button control:

- For basic play control, or for playing discs through a stereo system without using the TV, you can use the buttons on the front panel or on the remote control.
- The PLAY, PAUSE and STOP buttons operate in the same way as the corresponding on-screen functions.
- The NEXT and PREVIOUS buttons skip one track forward or backward respectively.

NOTE

The function of these buttons will depend completely on the specific application of each CD-I program.

#### Changing over to TV:

- Select the desired channel or input of your TV, using the controls of your TV set.
- When the CD-I player is switched on, its antenna signal is fed through to the TV and, depending on the player-TV connection, TV reception might be interrupted automatically.
- To change over to TV reception at any time in such case, press the CDI/TV button (11) on the remote control.
- To return to CD-I play, press the CDI/TV button (11) on the remote control again.

## LOADING AND UNLOADING

#### Loading:

- · Point and click on 'Open' (you may also press the OPEN/-CLOSE button (2) on the player) to open the disc tray (1).
- Take the disc from its holder and place it on the tray with the label up.
- · Point and click on 'Close' (you may also press the OPEN/-CLOSE button (2) on the player, or gently push the front of the tray) to close the tray.
- The TV screen changes according to the type of disc.

Sound level:

- When playing any disc adjust the sound level as required, preferably on the TV or HiFi amplifier.
- The volume up (9)/down (10) buttons on the remote control may also be used, but for each disc these controls always start at a level set in the setting menu.

A suitable level must therefore be first set on the TV or HiFi amplifier.

#### Unloading:

- · Point and click on 'Open' (you may also press the OPEN/CLOSE button (2) to open the disc loading tray.
- The player start-up screen reappears on the TV.
- Take the disc from the tray and replace it in its holder.
- · Point and click on 'Close' (you may also press the OPEN/CLOSE button (2) on the player, or gently press the front of the tray) to close the tray with or without a new disc.

#### NOTE

- You may unload the disc at any time by pressing the OPEN/CLOSE button (2).
- Unloading a CD-I disc while the CD-I program is running, will terminate the CD-I program abruptly. 'Bookmarks' or intermediate results, if used by the CD-I program, might not be updated to the latest situation.

## **PLAYING A CD-I DISC**



The tray may also be closed by gently pressing the front of it.





- After creating a Favorite Track Selection for a disc, you can compose a title of approx. 30 characters (depending on the character width) for the selection using the keyboard screen.
- The title then appears on the CD-Audio screen whenever the disc is loaded.
- At the CD-Audio screen, 'point-and-click' on the program star, then 'point-and-click' on the save diamond.
- The CD-Audio screen will change KEYBOARD SCREEN to the keyboard screen.
- · Select each character of the title in turn, using "shift" to change between upper and lower case characters and "space" to separate words.

## PLAYING AN AUDIO CD

- To let the picture channel bar appear/disappear click on the action button anywhere outside the channel bar.

2. Creating FTS titles

## **BEFORE REQUESTING SERVICE**

If it appears that the CD-I player is faulty, first consult this check-

list. It may be that something simple has been overlooked. Under no circumstances attempt to repair the system yourself; this will invalidate the warranty.

	Check that the ON/OFF button (7) is set to on. Check that both plugs on the power cord are properly connected. Check that there is power at the AC outlet by plugging in another appliance.
	Check that the TV is switched on. Select the same channel or input on the TV as that of the player or check the video connection.
Distorted picture•	Check the disc for fingerprints and clean with a soft cloth, wiping from center to edge.
No open icon on TV screen•	Switch the player off, then switch on again while holding the STOP button (6) pressed.
•	Check that the disc label is facing up. Clean the disc. Check if the disc is defective by trying another disc.
No sound•	Check audio connections. If using a HiFi amplifier, try another sound source.
Distorted sound from HiFi amplifier•	Check to ensure that audio connections have not been made to the amplifier Phono input.
	Reset by switching the player off, then on again. Check to see if the CD-I program requires another disc to be loaded.
•	Aim the remote control directly at the sensor on the player. Avoid all obstacles which may interfere with the signal path. Disconnect the device connected to Input (rear) <b>(9)</b> .

• Inspect or replace the remote control batteries.

## GLOSSARY

For your convenience, the following list of terms is provided to help you understand the CD-I Player and its operation.

AUDIO OUT – There are two jacks located on the back of your CD-I Player. They are used to send audio (sound) from the Player to either the TV, Stereo Receiver, or Amplifier. You could also hook it up to a VCR (Video Cassette Recorder) or Audio Cassette Recorder to record sound sent out from your Player.

CD, CD-DA, or CD-AUDIO – Terms to describe a disc that produces only audio (sound) for your CD-I Player. CD = Compact Disc

**CD-DA =** Compact Disc-Digital Audio **CD-Audio =** Compact Disc Audio

CD GRAPHICS – a technique for generating text, still pictures, or animated graphics that are related to the sound portion of the Compact Disc (CD).

**CD-I** – Compact Disc Interactive. A type of disc with both pictures and sound. Interacting with the disc allows you to tailor it to your taste.

**CD-I PLAYER** – Compact Disc Interactive Player. A device that allows you to play several types of discs, including CD-Is, CDs, Photo-CDs, and CD-ROM XA (Bridge).

**CD-I/TV SELECTOR BUTTON** – This button turns the signal sent from the CD-I Player to the TV on and off. When turned ON, only sound and/or pictures sent from the Player itself will be seen and heard on your TV. When turned OFF, picture and sound received from your antenna, cable system, or VCR can be seen and heard on your TV.

**CD-ROM-XA (Bridge)** – One of several types of discs you can play in your CD-I Player.

**DISPLAY** – Lights up on Player's Display Panel showing which feature(s) being used.

**FEATURE** – A task the CD-I Player can perform. For example, the Dim feature of the Player will dim your TV screen if it is selected.

ICON – a display on one of the CD-I shell screens. The icon shows where to place the arrow and press on one of the ACTION buttons to begin that feature. Example: "PLAY CD-I ▶" on the CD-I screen. Place the arrow on top of the "▶" and click on one of the ACTION button and the CD-I begins playing.

MODE – The operating condition or status of the CD-I Player. This is determined by the function currently engaged and/or the setting selected. For example, "Play mode". PAUSE – Temporarily stopping play of a CD-Audio. When in the Play mode, press the PAUSE button to put the CD-I Player in the Pause mode.

**PHOTO-CD** – A type of compact disc on which photographs have been stored.

**PLAY** – The act of the Player taking the picture and/or sound from a disc and sending it to your TV and/or Stereo Receiver or Amplifier. You must press the PLAY button or select the PLAY icon before the Player will start reading a disc.

**REMOTE CONTROL** – By pressing the buttons on the remote, signals are sent to the CD-I player to perform desired task(s), for example, PLAY.

**RF COAXIAL CABLE** – Black, insulated, round cable used to connect the CD-I Player to the TV.

SCREENS – Word used when discussing your TV, for example, "TV screen" refers to the area on the TV for viewing pictures.Word also used when discussing CD-I Player display screens, for example, the "CD-I Player Start-Up screen." These screens allow you to select functions you want the Player to perform.

STOP – Ending play of a disc. When in the Play mode, press the STOP button to end play of a CD-Audio, CD-I or other disc in your Player.

THUMBPAD – The part of the remote control used to guide the arrow across the screen. Place the arrow on top of the icon of a feature you want to perform.

TRACKS – Disc sections varying in length. There can be many tracks on one disc, with each track a distinct unit. Tracks are important in using the Scan and Shuffle features.

VIDEO OUT – There is one jack on the back of your CD-I Player that can be used to send pictures (video) to your TV. You could also hook it to a VCR (Video Cassette Recorder) to record pictures sent out from the Player.

VOLUME – The amount of sound you hear.


